The F Word is a lighthearted romantic comedy. Wallace is a medical school dropout who's given up on relationships when he meets Chantry, an animator. They hit it off immediately, but Wallace soon discovers that Chantry has a boyfriend. The two decide to just be friends, but as their friendship grows, so do their romantic feelings for one another. Although there is a fair amount of swearing, the film is relevant for teenagers and can open up insightful discussions about relationships, friendship, and growing up.
